

Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Revised

Our school has chosen Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Revised as our systematic, synthetic phonics (SSP) programme to teach early reading and spelling.





Phonics is:

24

making connections between the sounds of our spoken words and the letters that are used to write them down.





Phonics is:

... the sound that letters make.

- Phonemes
- Graphemes

The name of a letter and the sound it makes is very different. - The first key focus is the sound.

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




Blending to read words


Year 1

- Sounds that can be written in the same way but make a different sound cow/snow.










How do we teach reading in books?

Reading practice sessions are:

- when your child is ready for blending.
- three times a week Decoding, Prosody, Comprehension
- taught in small groups
- matched to your childs assessment level
- building fluency





Reading a book at the right level

This means that your child should:

- Know all the sounds and tricky words in their phonics book well
- Read many of the words by silent blending (in their head) their reading will be automatic
- Any stopping and sound out they do need to do should be able to do this on their own.

Reading with this fluency will enable your child to develop a greater sense of reading for meaning – using expression in their voice and being able to answer simple comprehension questions about the book.







 Describe things you see.



- Talk about the book and celebrate their success!






Year 1 Phonics Screening Check
