There you will find some videos featuring 'Amanda and Keith'. Sit back, relax and watch the videos for your introduction to volcanoes and what they are.</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> Handed in.</p>	<p>English: Using your geography skill research</p> <p>Chose 8 of of the facts you like and create a leaflet to summarise what you know. Think of a title and 1 or 2 sentences for each fact. <p>Art and Design:</p> <p>What is a Volcano? Use the 'What is a Volcano' diagram on the 'Volcanoes of Ecuador' poster to find out how a volcano forms and what it is like under the surface. Listen carefully to the commentary Look at the clip of what it is like inside a volcano and think about how you would describe it.</p> <p>Read & Think Now read the information on the BBC Bitesize page. Think carefully about the key words, the ones in BOLD type. If you are not sure what some of them mean, use a dictionary to find out.</p> <p>Watch, Read & Take Notes Watch the videos again and this time you will take some notes. It will help if you print the 'Volcanoes – Taking Notes' page and use the prompts for guidance. Visit the BBC Bitesize page again and reread the information.
