Message from Mr Kilbride

Plenty to digest this week so I will be very brief. Lovely affirmation of our efforts from our KCC School improvement Advisor, who visited on Tuesday. He commented that he always enjoys coming to High Firs and that it is a little bit better each time he visits. It is lovely to have an occasional pair of eyes notice improvements that are not always immediately apparent to those of us immersed in school every day. Showing our advisor round High Firs was a real pleasure and we really enjoyed seeing the progress being made by children after a detailed study of their exercise books.

Uniform ordering

We have changed the way that polo shirts, sweatshirts & cardigans with the school logo can be ordered; we will no longer stock these items in school but they can now be purchased direct from Brigade Clothing online at https://www.brigade.uk.com/parents/school/HI4500DS/



Orders are placed in a queue until the 15th and 30th of each month and delivered into school up to 14 days after. They will then be distributed via the children. Please note that home delivery charges will apply during the summer holidays. For more information, see the flier later on in this Newsletter.

For polo shirts without the school logo most supermarkets offer these but we would currently recommend Next ("yellow") or Marks & Spencer ("gold") as these are the best colour matches to our branded uniform.

All others items, such as water bottles, bags & hats, can still be purchased via our office.



PE Kit update

For PE, we will be making the phased change to plain (no logos), round-neck t-shirts in your child's house colour (royal blue/red/green/ yellow) rather than white. So, if you need to replace your child's PE t-shirt please buy one of these in future - we would ask that all children please have a t-shirt in their house colour by Sept 2023.

Strike Action

All members of the NEU teaching union have been balloted to undertake strike action on Wednesday 1st February. Whilst teachers do not have to strike, the school must recognise the right of staff to do so if they wish. Members are not required to let the school know in advance of their intention to strike and this obviously places schools in a very difficult situation with regards to closure of classes. However, we can confirm we now intend for school to be open on this date.

RSPB Birdwatch

Our classes enjoyed learning about the annual RSPB Birdwatch in their assembly on Wednesday this week. If you would like to take part this year then all you have to do is watch and count which birds you can spot in about an hour over the next few days – it might be on a walk, from your window or in your garden. 




HOW TO MEASURE YOUR CHILD

Measure the actual body measurements as this is far more accurate than measuring over clothes.

CHEST: Measure around the chest at the fullest part, placing the tape close up under the arms.

COLLAR: Measure around the base of the neck where the collar sits, inserting two fingers between the neck and tape to allow growth



WAIST: Measure around the natural waistline.

TROUSER LENGTH: Measure the inside leg from crotch to floor without shoes on. HIPS: Measure around your hips, 20cm (8") below your natural waistline.

SKIRT LENGTH: Measure from the waist down to where you would want the hem DRESS & PINAFORE LENGTH: Measure from nape of neck to length required.


