Home Learning menus will be given to the children at the start of term with the children expected to complete 3 or 4 tasks across the term.

The children can complete the tasks in any order. Children's books need to be handed in on a Thursday with books returned on Friday. Children are expected to complete their home learning to the best of their ability.

In school we will focus on consolidating our knowledge of number bonds and then building up to learning our times tables throughout the year.

Practicing using numbots at home will be very beneficial. We will also be learning spellings based on the year 2 spelling patterns and curriculum words – these will be practiced in school initially with spelling lists sent home later in the term.

# Reading

Parents are asked to hear their child read regularly and to record this in their reading record.

Remember to ask your child questions based on what they are reading. You can discuss the book before reading, then ask them questions during and at the end of the book.
