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Message from Mr Kilbride

Thank you so much to everyone who supported the wearing something blue for World Diabetes Day this Tuesday. This event prompted a fabulous question and answer session in assembly with a pupil with diabetes in school, helping children to better understand what it is like living with diabetes.

Thank you also for your donations of coppers for Children in Need – the children really enjoyed wearing a Pudsey item into school today. Four Pudsey silhouettes were filled with coins – we will update you next week on the amount raised, once the School Council have had a chance to count it.

In addition, it has been Anti-Bullying week in school this week. This year's theme has been 'Make some noise' about bullying. As part of looking into this, two definitions were shared with the children, relating to: bullying - "The **repetitive**, **intentional hurting** of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an **imbalance of power**. Bullying can be physical, verbal or psychological. It can happen face to face or online"; and to banter — "The playful and friendly exchange of teasing remarks." It was also discussed with children that it is no longer banter if:

- 1. You would be upset if someone said it to you
- 2. It's hurtful
- 3. You're not friends
- 4. Someone's asked you to stop
- 5. The target isn't laughing
- 6. It focuses on someone's insecurities

This work was further explored in lessons and will support children in maintaining our school values of – be kind, be safe, be honest and be your best.

Christmas / Winter Card Competition

The children will be bringing home a piece of coloured card today so that everyone can take part in our annual competition to design a Christmas or Winter Card.

There are a few simple guidelines:

- All cards must be on a Christmas or Winter theme and using the piece of card you are given – apart from that you can use whatever you like to make your card!

- Please do not write inside your card
- Write name and class on the back

Please bring your completed card to school on **Friday 24**th **Nov.** All cards will then be displayed in the hall and parents are invited to come in to view them after school on **Monday 27**th **November.**






Our Christmas Charities 2023



Seats must be booked for all performances; please do not attend without a ticket! Please use the forms in this Newsletter to request your tickets and return by **FRIDAY 24TH NOVEMBER** – tickets run out quickly so return as soon as you can.

Tickets will be allocated as follows:

- In the first instance a total limit of two tickets will be allocated for the class concert / performances in which your child(ren) will be taking part (this may be two tickets for one performance or one ticket for each performance).
- Parents may request additional seats for their child(ren)'s own performances, which will then be allocated on a 'lucky dip' basis following initial allocations.
- Should any seats still be available after this time then they will be made available to parents in other classes, again on a 'lucky dip' basis.

We welcome pre-school age children to attend performances this year, however, if they are walkers, they will require a ticket. If they are 'babes in arms' they can attend without a ticket.

All audience members will be asked to sit in their seat and to watch quietly, enabling the children on stage to do their best. If there is any disruption from younger viewers, we would expect parents/guardians to show consideration by settling or removing their child. If disruption persists, you may be asked to leave to allow the performance to continue smoothly.

We cannot accommodate prams and buggies in the building – but you are welcome to leave them outside on entry.

There is no charge to attend the performances but visitors are invited to donate to the collection for one of our chosen charities.

All High Firs children will have the opportunity to watch the performances and concerts during school time.

Park and Stride parking

Please can parents making use of Park and Stride avoid parking and turning in the driveway of Winton Court Flats. We have had recent complaints from residents who have been unable to access their parking space or driveway, due to parents using the Park and Stride service.

After requesting that parents do not park in the bays reserved for the three houses at the top of Goldsel Road following similar complaints from residents, people have heeded that request and no further issues have been observed.

We ask that you turn in the road and park for dropping on the double yellow lines at the top end of Goldsel Road - this is what our risk assessment allows for.
