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Message from Mr Kilbride

As we anticipate the final 2 weeks before we break up for the Christmas holidays, the rhythm of the school year is very much set with rehearsals taking up some of the school day and keeping the children going with 'normal' timetables and lessons for the rest of the time.

Next week is extremely busy with both performances of the Y5/6 production, both performances of the Y3/4 carol concert, Christmas lunch and Christmas jumper day, the in-school Pantomime, donations for the Christmas Fayre and the Christmas Fayre itself! If we are still on our feet after that lot, the following week we look forward to the KS1 performance, the Rocksteady concert, the secrets room and a visit from Father Christmas himself! We will well and truly have earned a rest come the 15th December!

For performances this year, we have removed the booking of individual seats and we have altered the stage layout, so performances will be from the side of the hall to a wide space that does not go so far back. The aim of this is to simplify the process around arranging tickets and to hopefully give larger numbers of the audience a chance of a good view of the action.

Please remember that everyone attending will need a ticket – with the exception of babes in arms.

For the Y5/6 production, you can arrive and queue as you would for a class assembly – at the gates around the side of school. We will open the gates and let people come in and choose their seats from 1.45pm - 15 minutes before the afternoon performance is due to start. For the evening performance, please drop your children at 6pm and we will let you come straight in and take your seats a little earlier.

For the Y3/4 evening carol concert, please bring your children at 6.15pm and you can come straight in to take your seats in readiness for the 6.30pm start – as per arrangements in the letter that went out last Thursday.
