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#### Message from Mr Kilbride

Welcome back to Term 3 – Happy New Year. I hope you all enjoyed the break over the Christmas holidays and return to school this week raring to go!

Children have the chance this year now to earn Values pencils for their actions exemplifying our school values. There is a set of four to collect by the end of the school year and all members of staff will be looking out for children's achievements. At the end of each month, our usual Friday celebration assembly will be replaced with the awarding of that month's values pencils. The pencils match the theme colours of our school values – pink for Be Kind, yellow for Be Your Best, blue for Be Honest and green for Be Safe.

This week I want to signpost parents towards some information and resources to help keep children safe online. I am sure over Christmas that some children will have received gifts of new technology — most of which may well have internet access capabilities. This opens a world of possibility and opportunity, but also exposes children to a wide range of new risks that would not otherwise be present.

Where parents choose not to follow these age recommendations, it is essential that a high level of monitoring of child online activity takes place – for example, daily checking of activity or installing apps that enable child activity to be viewed directly on parent/carer devices. I hope that by following some of this advice, parents can create the right conditions for children to get the maximum benefit from using technology, with risks being closely monitored and managed.



#### **Resolution Read at Home**

Our annual "Resolution Read at Home" was launched in today's assembly. As part of our ongoing commitment to developing our children's reading once again we are asking all our children and families to make a New Year's resolution to support our annual **RESOLUTION READ AT HOME** challenge throughout January and until 2<sup>nd</sup> February by reading at home **at least five times a week**. As you will know, it is part of our Home Learning policy that all the children read at home and that an adult then signs their Reading Record or Contact Book to indicate this; we do appreciate that so many of our families do this already and give vital support to their children's reading development. The children will be given one house point for every time that they read at home and that their contact book or reading record is signed to show this when it is checked by a member of staff in the morning. There will be certificates each week for those children who have read at least five times and a special reward for those who achieve this every week during the challenge!
