- Please make sure all clothes, bags, water bottles and PE kits are labelled with your child's name.
- On P.E. days, please could earrings be removed at home before school. If not, could micropore tape be sent into school so children can cover their earrings for safety during the P.E. lesson.
- Children will again be given a "home learning menu"; please complete a minimum of **9 tasks** this term.
