# Learning at home

### Home Learning Menu


Home Learning menus will be given to the children at the start of each term with the children expected to complete 4 tasks across the term.

The children can complete the tasks in any order. Children are expected to complete their home learning to the best of their ability.

#### Readina

Parents are asked to hear their child read at least 4 times a week and ideally every day. Please record this in your child's reading record.

Remember to ask your child questions based on what they are reading. You can discuss the book before reading and then ask them questions whilst reading and when the book is completed. In school we use VIPERS questions so the children are able to answer different question types.









In school we will continue to build on our times tables knowledge and we are working on the 2, 5- and 10-times tables. Last term we began using times tables rock stars in school, this can also be accessed at home. Please encourage your child to play 'garage' mode when using this as it has teacher set targets. It is also set to 'automatic progress' meaning that as your child's speed in recalling the tables improves it will give them more challenging tables. This will also include division sums.

We will continue to be complete weekly spelling tests. Although we practise the spellings in school it would also be beneficial to practise them at home. Each spelling list is linked to an assignment on spelling shed - using this is a great way to encourage the children to learn the words in a fun way.
