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#### Message from Mr Kilbride

A busy week flies by once again! Thank you to Mr Johnson, parent and tennis coach, who gave up his time to come in and provide extra tennis tuition to Y3 over the past two Mondays – they really enjoyed the sessions and were kept super active. Our Tuesday cricket sessions are proving a hit this term too with Mr Sharma from Kent Cricket coming in to work with Years 2, 3, 5 and 6.

Another Times Tables rockstars assembly this Thursday saw Ellie from Year 4 come to the front to try and beat the teacher – she scored a superb 26 in one minute – not quite winning, but one of our top pupil scores for Year 4. Keep encouraging your children to practise regularly – they are now earning house points when we can see on the system that they have reached a certain amount of time spent practising.

Thank you for bearing with us yesterday, as we relocated Year 1 to the hall in order to make way for their classroom to be used as a Polling Station in the Local Elections. I know this made things more challenging at drop off and pick up, but the success is that we managed to keep the school open and continue education for all, with minimal disruption to the school day for the vast majority of pupils. There may well be another two occasions where we are asked to be re-organised in this way for elections before the calendar year is out.

### **Restart a Heart – Community Defibrillator**

Did you know we have a Community "Restart a Heart" Defibrillator available at school? This can be removed from site in the case of an emergency and is available at all times during

school hours. Other local sites can also be found at https://www.defibfinder.uk/ A defibrillator can be used under 999 direction when someone is experiencing Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA). Symptoms of this are immediate and drastic and include:

- No breathing, or gasping noises paired with abnormal breathing.
- Unresponsive.
- Unconscious.
- No pulse.


# Art Newsletter

This year in Art at High Firs, we are focussing on developing assessment strategies including self-assessment. One of the ways we have introduced self-assessment during Art is to have 'Gallery Time'. This involves allowing children and the teacher time to walk around the classroom looking at their classmates artwork. Focussed questions will have been shared, for the children to consider whilst viewing the artwork. Pupils have found 'Gallery Time' an enjoyable and useful tool in which to reflect upon their artwork.

## Curriculum Learning Journey:

It is wonderful to see the progression in art made by the children throughout their High Firs journey. This progression is highlighted by a display outside the Year 2 classroom. It shows an Art Curriculum Learning Journey of drawing skills. All children in the school drew an apple. The development of drawing skills is great to see!




## **Pupil Voice:**
