INFORMATION ABOUT THE GOVERNING BODY:

Structure and Remit of The Governing Body and its Committees:

The Governing Body consists of 9 Governors.

Of these:

2 are elected by parents

1 is appointed by the Local Authority

1 is elected by the staff

1 is the Headteacher

4 are Co-opted Appointed by the Governing Body.

The Governing Body may also appoint Associate Members, who are not Governors and do not have voting rights at the Full Governing Body, but who attend Full Governing Body meetings and may be appointed to sit on a committee with or without voting rights. Except for the Headteacher, all Governors are appointed or elected for a term of 4 years.

The Governing Body delegates some its functions and responsibilities to one of 2 committees – Curriculum and Inclusion (C&I) and Finance and Premises (F&P). For the academic year 2021- 22, membership of these committees is as shown in the table above. The Full Governing Body and each of the committees meet a minimum of 3 times a year.
