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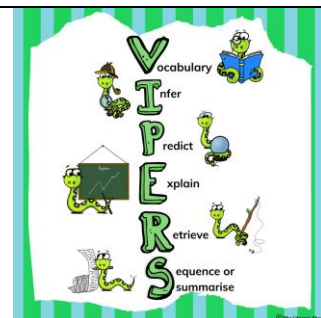
Learning at home

Home learning menus will be given to the children at the start of each term with the children expected to complete 3 or 4 tasks across the half term. The children can complete the tasks in any order and once the children have completed a task they need to hand it in by Thursday of that week.

Reading

Parents are asked to hear their child read at least 4 times a week and ideally every day. Please record this in your child's reading record. Remember to ask your child questions based on what they are reading as this helps to develop their understanding, as well as, fluency. Questions can be asked before, during and after reading and can be based on the VIPERS question styles. Once a book has been read at home the children will complete an accelerated reader task.



Extra Support



In school we will continue to build on our times tables knowledge and our focus will be the 5 times tables. We will be using Times Tables Rock Stars in school to support this. I know some children are already using this at home and I would encourage all children to give it a try 😊. Please encourage your child to play 'garage' mode when using this as it has teacher set targets. It is also set to 'automatic progress' meaning that as your child's speed in recalling the tables improves it will give them more challenging tables. This will also include division sums.

We will continue to complete weekly spelling tests. Although we practise the spellings in school it would also be beneficial to practise them at home. Each spelling list is linked to an assignment on Spelling Shed - using this is a great way to encourage the children to learn the words in a fun way.
