


Stone Age to Bronze Age

In the grid below are your different homework tasks for this term. Please choose **at least 5 pieces** of homework to complete this term, to be handed in between Thursday 11th September to Thursday 16th October. You do not need to hand in one every week but by Thursday 16th October you should have handed in at least 5 pieces of home learning.

<p>Go on a rock hunt and see if you can find some different types of rocks. Can you tell if they are metamorphic, sedimentary or igneous?</p>	<p>Research to see if there are any remains from the Stone Age, Bronze Age or Iron Age in our local area. Where are they? What are they?</p>	<p>Make a prehistoric menu. What sorts of food would they have eaten? Maybe have a go at making your paper look like it has aged!</p>			
<p>Make a photo montage of some prehistoric monuments.
